A committee reviewed nominations, made recommendations and determined 2012's Agriculture Environmental Steward and Conservation Farm of the Year award to be given at the Ag Development Harvest Tour at the end of September.

Erosion Control through Hydroseeding Soil Stabilization

Soil erosion occurs from weather events but also because of the health of the soil. Soil types, composition, organic compounds and aeration practices can all make a difference in its stability.

In 2012, the District added Hydroseeding to the tool kit for stream and roadbank stabilization, drainage and construction site stabilization.

Hydroseeding is a water base application of



seed and a organic "tactifier" that acts as glue to hold the soil and seed in place for a period of time until the seeds can get a root base to hold the soil down. Although seeding and general mulching is still an approved soil conservation practice, hydroseeding because of the included moisture allows for the material to begin growing sooner than traditional mulching.

In 2012, the District assisted with mulching for the Arcadia—Lyons Canal Trail, scheduled to open in the spring of 2013.
